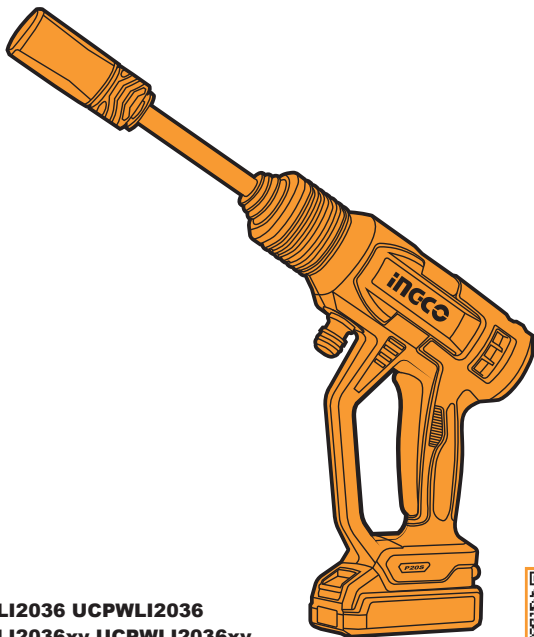

GENERAL SAFETY WARNINGS

⚠ WARNING! Read all safety warnings, instructions, illustrations and specifications provided with this power tool. *Failure to follow all instructions listed below may result in electric shock, fire and/or serious injury.*

Save all warnings and instructions for future reference.

The term "power tool" in the warnings refers to your mains-operated (corded) power tool or battery-operated (cordless) power tool.

1) Work area safety

- a) **Keep work area clean and well lit.** *Cluttered or dark areas invite accidents.*
- b) **Do not operate power tools in explosive atmospheres, such as in the presence of flammable liquids, gases or dust.** *Power tools create sparks which may ignite the dust or fumes.*
- c) **Keep children and bystanders away while operating a power tool.** *Distractions can cause you to lose control.*

2) Electrical safety

- a) **Power tool plugs must match the outlet. Never modify the plug in any way.** **Do not use any adapter plugs with earthed (grounded) power tools.** *Unmodified plugs and matching outlets will reduce risk of electric shock.*
- b) **Avoid body contact with earthed or grounded surfaces, such as pipes, radiators, ranges and refrigerators.** *There is an increased risk of electric shock if your body is earthed or grounded.*

3) Personal safety

4) Power tool use and care

Tips for maintaining maximum battery life

- b) **Never recharge a fully charged battery cartridge.** *Overcharging shortens the battery service life.*
- c) **Charge the battery cartridge with room temperature at 10°C-40°C (50°F-104°F).** *Let a hot battery cartridge cool down before charging it.*
- d) **Charge the battery cartridge if you do not use it for a long period (more than six months).**

Important safety instructions for battery cartridge

- a) **Before using battery cartridge, read all instructions and cautionary markings on battery charger, battery, and) product using battery.**
- b) **Do not disassemble battery cartridge.**
- c) **If operating time has become excessively shorter, stop operating immediately.** *It may result in a risk of overheating, possible burns and even an explosion.*
- d) **If electrolyte gets into your eyes, rinse them out with clear water and seek medical attention right away.** *It may result in loss of your eyesight.*
- e) **Do not short the battery cartridge:**

Tool / battery protection system

The tool is equipped with a tool/battery protection system. This system automatically cuts off power to the motor to extend tool and battery life. The tool will automatically stop during operation if the tool or battery is placed under one of the following conditions:

Overload protection

When the battery is operated in a manner that causes it to draw an abnormally high current, the tool automatically stops without any indication. In this situation, turn the tool off and stop the application that caused the tool to become overloaded. Then turn the tool on to restart.

Overheat protection

When the tool/battery is overheated, the tool stops automatically. In this situation, let the tool/battery cool before turning the tool on again.

Transportation

Batteries comply with all applicable shipping regulations as prescribed by industry and legal standards (for more information, check with the manufacturer).

Transporting batteries can possibly cause fire if the battery terminals inadvertently come in contact with conductive materials. When transporting batteries, make sure that the battery terminals are protected and well insulated from materials that could contact them and cause a short circuit.

Assembly

CAUTION!

- Always be sure that the tool is switched off and the battery cartridge is removed before adjusting or checking function on the tool.
- See the following instructions for the functions of the operating elements.
- Ensure safety instructions are followed at all times!

Installing or removing battery cartridge (see Figure A)

Figure A: 1. Button 2. Battery cartridge

CAUTION!

- Always switch off the tool before installing or removing of the battery cartridge.
- Hold the tool and the battery cartridge firmly when installing or removing battery cartridge. Failure to hold the tool and the battery cartridge firmly may cause them to slip off your hands and result in damage to the tool and battery cartridge and a personal injury.

To remove the battery cartridge, slide it from the tool while sliding the button on the front of the cartridge.

To install the battery cartridge, align the tongue on the battery cartridge with the groove in the housing and slip it into place. Insert it all the way until it locks in place with a little click.

CAUTION!

- Always install the battery cartridge fully until the button completely release. If not, it may accidentally fall out of the tool, causing injury to you or someone around you.
- Do not install the battery cartridge forcibly. If the cartridge does not slide in easily, it is not being inserted correctly.

Indicating the remaining battery capacity (see Figure B)

Figure B: 1. Indicator lamps 2. Check button

Press the check button on the battery cartridge to indicate the remaining battery capacity. The indicator lamps light up for few seconds.

NOTE: Depending on the conditions of use and the ambient temperature, the indication may differ slightly from the actual capacity.

Installing or removing water pipe (see Figure C, D)

CAUTION!

The unit is not suitable for connection to a potable water supply

When installing, push the quick water inlet connector up and insert it into the water inlet connector on the machine. After inserting, gently pull the water pipe back to check whether it is firmly installed and does not fall off.

When removing the water pipe, pull down the external plastic sleeve of the water inlet quick connector to remove the water pipe.

Water connection (see Figure E)

Access the water in the container: When accessing the water in the container, you can directly put the end of the water pipe with the filter head into the container, and the car wash will automatically absorb water.

ATTENTION!

- **When accessing the water in the container, the lowest water level should be higher than the height of the filter head.**
- **When accessing the water in the container, ensure that there is no cloudy debris in the water, otherwise it is easy to block the filter head.**

Installing plastic bottle adapter (optional accessory) (see Figure F, G)

Figure F: 1. Plastic bottle adapter 2. Suction pipe
3. Plastic bottle 4. Water hose connector

- a) Fill water in a plastic bottle.
- b) Throw the suction pipe down through the bottle opening.
- c) Attach the adapter to the bottle by threading the nut of the coupling sleeve.
- d) Attach the plastic bottle adapter to the water hose connector on the pressure washer.

Place the coupling sleeve over the inlet of the connector and push it through until the coupling sleeve is secured in place.

CAUTION!

Be sure to attach the plastic bottle adapter securely to the pressure washer and plastic bottle. Failure to do so may cause the bottle to fall resulting in personal injury.

NOTE: A use of 2-liter (half-gallon) plastic bottle can be favored for containing water.

Installation or removing of spray gun lance extension (see Figure H)

Installation

The first step is to insert the spray gun **lance extension** into the joint position of the machine until it cannot be pushed. The second step is to rotate the spray gun body to the left or right, stop rotating and release the spray gun when it can spring effectively, and then gently rotate the spray gun lever. If there is no rotation, install it in place.

Removing

When removing the spray gun, push the gun into the machine and rotate it at the same time (about 90 degrees) to remove the gun.

NOTE: When installing the gun shaft, align the positioning buckle on the gun shaft with the slot position inside the machine.

Foam nozzle (see Figure I)

For add soap need take off the foam nozzle first, pour the soap liquid and water into the soap liquid pot according to the proportion, and then install the soap pot with foam nozzle.

ATTENTION!

The device is designed for use with neutral, biodegradable cleaners. Other cleaners or chemicals may compromise the safety of the pressure washer and cause damage to it.

Nozzle functions

Multi-pattern (2-in-1) spray nozzle features a range of spray patterns that you can adjust depending on your washing needs. By combining two of the most-used spray patterns in one nozzle, simply dial in the right spray pattern for your task.

Power supply

The tool should be connected only to a power supply of the same voltage as indicated on the nameplate.

Operation

Switch On/Off (see Figure J)

Switch On: Press the switch to start the device.

Switch Off: Release the trigger.

After switch off remove the battery from the device.

Disconnect the high-pressure washer from the water supply system.

Press the switch to release the existing pressure in the system.

NOTE: After cleaning with detergent, rinse the detergent container with clean water.

Usage scenarios (see Figure K)

The equipment can be used for cleaning the family car, watering the flowers and washing the floor and carpet, etc.

MAINTENANCE&MALFUNCTIONS

Cleaning

CAUTION!

- Always be sure that the tool is switched off and the battery cartridge is removed before cleaning or performing any maintenance.
- Never use gasoline, benzine, thinner, alcohol or the like. Discoloration, deformation or cracks may result.

Ventilation openings and switch levers must be kept clean and free of foreign matter. Regularly clean the tool's air vents or whenever the vents start to become obstructed. The tool may be cleaned most effectively with compressed dry air.

WARNING!

- Always wear safety goggles when cleaning tools with compressed air.
- Do not attempt to clean by inserting pointed objects through openings.

Maintenance

CAUTION!

- Always be sure that the tool is switched off and the battery cartridge is removed before attempting to perform inspection or maintenance.
- Preventive maintenance performed by unauthorized personnel may result in misplacing of internal wires and components which could cause serious hazard.

Only use original spare parts / accessories from the manufacturer or authorized and qualified workshops.

Repairs should only be carried out by qualified technicians or by an authorized service center. Qualified technicians must have relevant training and experience, be familiar with the design and construction requirements of the product and understand and follow the safety regulations.

Categorically not to drop any mechanical impact on the packaging during transport. When unloading / loading is not allowed to use any kind of technology that works on the principle of clamping packaging.

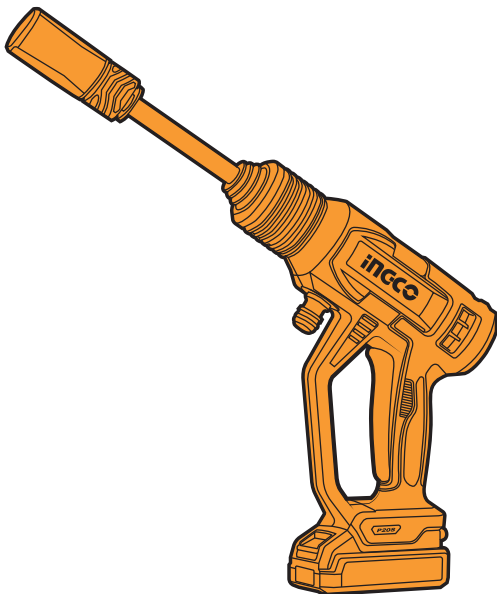
Storage

- a) Pour the water from the wireless pressure washer completely empty.
- b) Disconnect the device from the water supply system.
- c) Open the battery pressure washer for a few seconds until no more water comes out of the spray gun. Turn off the device.
- d) Store the spray gun vertically with the connecting side down.
- e) Completely empty the inlet hose and filter head.
- f) If the inside of the pressure washer is not completely emptied of water, it can be damaged by frost in cold weather.
- g) Store the equipment and accessories in an anti-freezing position.

Troubleshooting

Problem	Possible reasons	Measures
Intense pressure fluctuations	The nozzle is dirty/blocked.	Rinse the nozzle with water. Clean nozzle holes with a needle if needed.
Equipment not working	Low battery power.	Charge the rechargeable battery.
Water system leak	The connection is not installed correctly.	Turn off the device and remove the battery. Reconnect the unit to the water supply.
No water or little water	The water pipe is incorrectly connected and not in place.	Reconnect the pipe to the machine connector.
	The water level is below the filter head and cannot absorb water.	Increase the amount of water, or let the filter head completely sink in the water.
	The filter header is blocked.	Cleaning filter head.
	The nozzle is blocked.	Clean the nozzle.
	The water pipe was held down.	Remove pressure or replace pipe.



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
